

## Old-School Listing of United States Numismatic Sale Catalogues to 1940

The following is a listing of early (through 1940) numismatic auction catalogues, fixed price lists, and premium lists, available for sale at the stated prices. Increases in the costs of printing and postage have made it impossible to include much of what follows in our regularly held auctions, except in bulk lots. We acknowledge, however, that while bulk lots are great for getting started in a particular series, they can be frustrating to the collector wanting to plug only a few gaps in his or her collection—hence this list. By “old school,” we mean that it’s a pretty basic listing, with few comments on condition or contents beyond noting Adams A sales and rarities noted in Karl Moulton’s census published in the Winter 2005 issue of *The Asylum*. Condition in the following should be assumed to be very good (moderately worn, appropriate with age), though there are exceptions in either direction. Pricing is always noted. “PRL” means an original printed prices realized list is included with the catalogue (photocopies are noted). The vast majority of these are inexpensive, though we have included a few (far more extensively described) gems to give the listing some spice. We hope you enjoy it.

### Terms of Sale

All items should be assumed to be one-of-a-kind, though we have multiple copies of some. First come, first served. **Postage within the United States is a flat \$5**, whether you are buying one catalogue or fifty of them. Foreign postage is at cost.

 Adams 22, rated A in medals, comments, and Canadian, and A+ overall. An exceptional rarity among plated Chapman sales, being one of the most difficult large-size Chapmans to locate with plates. Unlike some rare catalogues, however, this one remains of the highest importance for its content. Adams rates the sale an A+, overall: "Superb historic collection, definitive for early war medals, Indian peace medals and Canadian." The plates are of remarkable beauty and clarity and are among the best produced by the Chapmans. Largely devoted to depicting a wide variety of Canadian historical medals, the last four plates also illustrate American medals, British medals, and a few English coins. Bowman page 18: "Mr. Hunter was a barrister in Toronto. His collection ... included such rarities as 53 Indian Chief medals, a gold Beaver Club medal, 7 Louisbourg medals, 2 Oswego medals, 2 Canada Subdued medals, 2 Montreal Taken medals, 2 Upper Canada Preserved medals, 81 war medals, 4 jetons, wheat sheaf, a side view, Northwest, Molson, set Hudson's Bay, Lauzon, 2 bridge tokens and many others." Bowman's emphasis is on Canadian material; U.S. collectors also be interested in knowing that the sale includes (and the plates depict) not one but *two* oval Washington Indian Peace Medals. A scarce and important catalogue, featuring the famed 1799 Abbey cent, which sold to "Livingston" for \$45.

The photographically illustrated edition of Elder's first blockbuster catalogue, bound with the saleroom copy used at the sale by dealer Elmer Sears, who recorded the buyers of many of the more important lots. The Gschwend collection begins with exceptional colonials, many of which are plated: an NE shilling; Higley coppers; a Rosa Sine Spina; two Liber Natus pieces; Maryland silver; and so on. (The NE threepence and sixpence are fakes from the Clay sale; both coins were pulled from the auction.) The large cents and half cents include important specimens in remarkable condition. Pattern coins of the 1860s are very well represented. An excellent sale, and a useful reference for provenance studies, particular when many of the buyers' names have been recorded. William Hartman Woodin had purchased the collection intact from Gschwend and, after removing a small number of coins needed for his collection, consigned it to Elder. Elder called it "the finest and most important that has been held in this city since the Parmelee sale in 1890." Originally from Pennsylvania, Gschwend later moved to New York City, engaging in the dry goods business on Fifth Avenue. At the time of the sale, he was "one of the few remaining numismatists of the days when such men as Messrs Mickle, Newlin, Cogan, Woodard (*sic*), Bushnell, Hazeltine (*sic*), and Levick held their sway in the realm of coin collecting."
